

KLGA Executive Board and Committee Chairs ZOOM Meeting
Wednesday, January 27, 2021

Debbie Argy called the meeting to order at 11:07am. Debbie thanked everyone for attending. 14 members were at the ZOOM meeting. Debbie's goal is "How to Keep and Attract More Women to KLGA-18". She met with James and Loren and asked them "What do you currently do for us and the other golf organizations (KLGA-9 and KMGA) and what suggestions do you have to improve our program?" She enjoyed reading through previous notebooks to know the history of KLGA.

Debbie asked for the minutes from the November 16, 2020 meeting be approved.

Gaby Fellows, 1st Vice President:

Gaby has updated the bulletin board in the ladies locker room with the help of Jan Ivy. They also rearranged furniture for a more cozy atmosphere. She feels the corner wooden hutch takes up too much room, and she'd like it removed. Gaby is looking into creating a Golf Book lending library set in the locker room. Gaby will be updating the website and will help members who have difficulty accessing it. The password to access the KLGA website is "JamesRiver". Gaby and Debbie are working on a questionnaire to send out to members to find out how many members use the locker room, use the website, and if members would like other golf opportunities. She will ask that the questionnaire be returned in 5-7 days. Then she'll collate the results and send them to the membership,

Ronnie Matthews, Treasurer:

Ronnie discussed the budget and how the carryover to next year may be lower since we have fewer members. She pointed out several line items which could be cut to save money. The board decided to keep the budget as is and see how the year goes.

Mimi Taylor, 2nd Vice President/Competition Committee:

Mimi looked at the Proposed Competition Schedule for 2021. She said a second Bring-A-Friend has been added to the schedule. The Club Championship was moved back a week, now in early October. The 3 Member/Member events will use all 3 courses. Mimi is talking to KM about cart usage. If there is a shotgun start, two people in a cart is required. Having individual carts last year helped the pace of play and is preferred. It will depend on Covid how the carts are used. Mimi discussed having a Green/Gold combo tee flight or maybe just an event. The questionnaire will ask how the members feel about having a combo flight. Mimi said she will need more data to figure out the logistics for competition. Mimi discussed having Home and Away games. The 9 holers have H & A on their play day as part of their schedule. The Pros would like to do the pairing and scoring. The number 1 responsibility of the competition committee is to mix people up. The concern is that the Pros use the computer to set up the games and may not mix members up so we're not always playing with the same people. Mimi was asked how to let golfers know on play days if there is a cancellation or delay. She responded that an email was sent out to players as soon as word was out last year. She felt the competition committee did well in communicating last year.

Charlotte McGinnis, Handicaps:

Charlotte contacted people who didn't play much last year. We have 50 active members. Charlotte will post the HDCs on the bulletin board monthly in the locker room and also put a copy in the white book in the cabinet.

Susan Daily, Handicap Tournament:

No report. Thank you to Susan for setting up today's ZOOM meetings.

Charlotte McGinnis and Laverne Mitchell, Williamsburg Cup:

Charlotte reported that there was only one day of Williamsburg Cup last year to do Covid and weather. She hopes Williamsburg Cup will resume this year and will send out signup sheets later in the year.

Suzanne Sweeney, New Member Mentor:

Suzanne said we have 2 new members, Liz Bonis and Gaby Rengifo. She will put their names on the bulletin board. It was suggested that new members be given a list of names of current members who would play with them to introduce them to the courses.

Damarius Marion, Hospitality:

The luncheon options will continue to be announced on Punchbowl. Damarius will confirm the dates for luncheons. So far, luncheon meetings will be after the 3 Member/Member events and the Opening Day. She will try to keep the cost around \$20 using boxed lunches during Covid. The Opening Coffee on March 24th is set up by the club, and Debbie will work with Dana at KM to organize it.

Linda Rein, Punchbowl:

Linda said Punchbowl works well and will continue as usual. Another year of this service has been purchased.

Laverne Mitchell, Member-Guest:

Debbie reported for Laverne. She asked how the group felt about having the cocktail party the night before the Member-Guest. There was much discussion about areas around the club where the party could be hosted outside. Ronnie made a motion that we continue to have the Cocktail Party with an outside location in Kingsmill. It was seconded and passed. Laverne's report included the Tidewater Golf Association and the Peninsula Golf are available to those who qualify with HDC. She can be contacted for more information. Also, Laverne had a Hole-In-One on Plantation #9 on January 22, 2021. Congratulations!!

Marie Chico, Publicity:

Marie put information in the KM membership newsletter, which comes out digitally on Mondays. This is not the KCSA bulletin which is mailed to homes. KCSA asks for a fee to put information in their bulletin. During the season, Marie will be adding more information in the digital newsletter. All members can sign up for the newsletter through the KM website. Marie or any member of the board will help members if they are unable to access the newsletter.

Alice Whitechurch, Ringers:

Ringers will be the same as last year, \$9 payable to Ronnie at the Opening Coffee or by the first play day. Hole-In-One is \$3. Alice will have the forms attached to the Welcome Letter prior to the Opening Coffee. There was a discussion about adding the Green/Golf tee to Ringers.

Kathy Yeater, Directory:

Kathy asked for any updates to the Directory be sent to her by the end of February. She needs any changes in Name, Address, Phone numbers, Email addresses. Since the Directory can be accessed on the website, there is no need to print it, saving money in the budget. Anyone wanting a hard copy can print out the directory for themselves. Kathy will look through the Directory to make sure information is transferred to the website. The password to the KLGA website is "JamesRiver". All names and numbers are published behind the password so this information is not accessible to the public.

Fath Shartzter, Swinging-for-a-Cure:
