

## Williamsburg Cup

- 3 matches per year among the four clubs, each club competing against the other once
- Every club hosts an event in May, June and July
- The season concludes with a fourth date in August, which is a “Fun Day” open to all participants who played in the matches that year, plus invited guests deemed appropriate by the individual club representatives
- Each club’s team consists of 6 players, 3 two player teams, divided into three flights, for a net match play competition
- Overall team scores are recorded through the season and the club team that wins the most points is awarded “the Cup” for that year
- For each match, the player pays cart and lunch fees with an additional \$4 that is collected for prize money which is awarded to the individual winners on “Fun Day”
- Every year a club representative is chosen by the individual clubs and she chooses the team for each match, then coordinates with the other reps to facilitate all pertinent information, tournament dates and lunches
- Although play was suspended because of COVID, the 2020 season the club members were: Kingsmill, Two Rivers, Williamsburg National and The Golden Horseshoe.
- The 2021 seasonal meeting has not be held, so information is forthcoming.
- It is about friendly “match play” competition in the Williamsburg area.

## Women's Tidewater Golf Association

- Founded in 1924, at present there are 11 member clubs with approximately 80 members
- Monthly tournament at a different member club
- Season runs April through November with a mixture of formats
- Players are requested to play a minimum of three times per season
- Normally there are 4 flights
- Net and gross prizes are awarded on each play day
- Gift cards to be used in the pro shop of the club the day of play
- Annual dues are \$65
- Each tournament, the player is charged cart fees, which range from \$40 (Kingsmill) to \$19.50 and lunch that averages around \$25
- Max. handicap index is 22 for new members, but ladies who have been a member for many years are exempted from this rule
- If handicap index raises above 22 for the first year, player is put on probation until index is 22
- Each club has a representative who relays pertinent information to members and takes new member applications to be presented to the WTGA board
- New member applications are received throughout the season and are generally accepted, with notification in a few days
- Net and gross prizes are awarded on each play day
- It is a enjoyable way to meet fellow golfers from the Tidewater area.
